



Scott: Thanks for reading my Shakespearian AI experiment. Not everyone liked the format. I hope those who read it got the "Eleanor" bit.





Carrie: Alas, I suspected some would not take to the Chat-GTP Bard written style of my Douglas Adams story. I still felt it was worth trying. Perhaps you found some difficulty with my latest edition concerning missing chapters from the Book of Genesis. Whatever the case may be, feel free to critique it. It helps me learn. It still needs more editing.



Steve S: Thanks for the sound advice about being careful not to craft guided questions. I'll work on that. Early in August I asked Chat-GTP 3.0 using the same wording you used:

"who came up with the idea of using the unused foci as the origin point of the circular hodograph"

GTP-3.0 gave me the following response (1st of three paragraphs):

The concept of using the unused foci as the origin point of the circular hodograph is attributed to Carl Friedrich Gauss, a prominent mathematician, and physicist. Gauss introduced this idea as part of his work on celestial mechanics and the theory of orbits. His insights into celestial mechanics, particularly the mathematical description of planetary orbits, were revolutionary in the field of astronomy.

I learned that Carl Friedrich Gauss, did make many contributions to celestial mechanics. I immediately turned around and asked Chat-GTP for references linking his work as pointing to the use of the unused foci. Chat-GTP responded with:

I apologize for any confusion, but I must correct my previous response. After reviewing my knowledge base, I cannot confirm the specific attribution of the concept of using the unused foci as the origin point of the circular hodograph to Carl Friedrich Gauss. My earlier response might have been incorrect in this regard.

The concept of the circular hodograph and its origins might not have a single attributed source. It's possible that various mathematicians and astronomers have contributed to this idea over time. Unfortunately, I don't have access to specific sources to confirm the exact origin of this concept. If you're looking for more accurate and detailed information, I recommend consulting specialized literature on the history of celestial mechanics and orbital theory.

So... GTP-3.0 was caught speculating/fabricating alleged historical accounts. It also brings up an important question. Why didn't GTP 3.0 verify this itself? Shouldn't it have been easy to do?

Then, there was a recent upgrade to the GTP system with the introduction of GTP 3.5 and GTP-4, the latter costs \$20/ month. I have little desire to pay twenty bucks to see if the subscribed version would do any better. But I was willing to test the free version.

Asking GTP-3.5 using the exact same wording as before - again, I got a different response. The most relevant paragraphs were contained in the 1st and 4th paragraphs, which stated:

[1st Paragraph] The concept of using unused foci as the origin point of the circular hodograph is attributed to the mathematician George David Birkhoff. Birkhoff was an American mathematician who made significant contributions to various areas of mathematics, including celestial mechanics, dynamical systems, and fluid dynamics.


[4th Paragraph] The idea of using unused foci as the origin point of the circular hodograph is a clever geometric insight that Birkhoff developed to simplify the mathematical treatment of celestial mechanics problems. It highlights his creativity and deep understanding of mathematical concepts and their applications in physical sciences.


GTP 3.5's answer made me suspicious. It strikes me that attributing Birkhoff to the idea of using the unused foci as "a clever geometric insight", as being far less probable than assuming that either James Clerk Maxwell or William Rowan Hamilton themselves had come up with the idea. In any case, I immediately followed up asking CTP-3.5 for references. The response I got was:

I apologize for any confusion, but I must clarify that my previous response was not based on a specific reference or source. Instead, it was a synthesis of general knowledge about the topic up until my knowledge cutoff date in September 2021. While George David Birkhoff did make significant contributions to celestial mechanics and dynamical systems, including work related to the circular hodograph, I don't have access to specific references to provide

While still, apologetic, the answer struck me as an Al system's attempt to weasel out of saying it really didn't know. GTP-3.5 use of the term

"synthesis" strikes me as AI related guesswork. I also astonished that GTP-3.5 didn't suggest Maxwell or Hamilton - particularly Maxwell! As he infers using the unused foci in his popular book on physics, MATTER AND MOTION. I find it difficult that GTP-3.5's database would not have at least supplied the names of Maxwell and/or Hamilton's based on contents of Maxwell's book. Am I to understand that GTP 3.5 is unaware of the contents of the book? While Maxwell's doesn't say anything about coming up with the idea of using the unused foci, what he does discuss is that it would be "convenient" (See next page) to rotate Hamilton's circular hodograph 90 degrees around the hodograph's origin point – which we are to infer should be placed over the unused foci—"H". He never deliberately spells it out. Maxwell assembles a diagram using his drafting skills and does away with most of the circular hodograph, making it difficult to perceive. We are to infer that the origin of the hodograph (which, by the way, is not the actual center of the hodograph circle) is placed over the unused foci. I realize I have brough this point up over and over, ad nausea, because

Maxwell states:

"In applying the method of the hodograph to a planet, the orbit is which in one plane, we shall find it *convenient* to suppose the hodograph turned round its origin through a right angle, so that the vector of the hodograph is perpendicular instead of parallel to the velocity [of the orbiting planet] it represents."

It's interesting that Chat-GTP seems oblivious to these kinds of associations. I infer from this that this particular AI system doesn't perform the same kind of wetware associations we biological creatures use all the time.

Maxwell's writing style reminds me of Sgt. Joe Friday (played by Jack Web), from the show, Dragnet, "Just the facts, mam."

It remains my cognitive wetware's suspicion that Maxwell, probably early in his career, did personally perceive something important was missing from Kepler's 1nd law. Just about everyone who has at one time or other seriously pondered Kepler's 1st law has probably asked themselves *what does the other unused foci do?* Not only did Maxwell ponder this puzzle, I'm inclined to believe he did discovered its purpose. Much of my own research simply tries to improve on Maxwell's original diagram by distilling the original geometry into something simplified and more intuitively assessable to understand by everyone.

Greg R: After thinking about your expressed doubts in #445 concerning the accuracy of some of the alleged Michael material I've been discussing in TURBO, I realized it would probably serve best if I focus on discussing my own personal convictions, or held "beliefs", rather than pointing to what others might say about the matter. Hopefully, it's a better way of pointing out what parting-of-the-ways we might have concerning our differing perceptions or interpretations.
