Was there any doubt that I would review this book?

Lou Elizondo's kiss-and-tell-all book, IMMINENT, writes straightforwardly in what the author feels he can legally disclose to the public. The *About the Author* section states Elizondo's credentials:

> LUIS "LUE" ELIZONDO is the former head of the Advanced Aerospace Threat Identification Program (AATIP), the Pentagon unit that researched UFOs, now known as unidentified anomalous phenomena

(UAP). Prior to AATIP, Elizondo oversaw counterespionage and counterterrorism investigations worldwide for the Department of Defense, and also worked for the Office of the National Counterintelligence Executive and the Office of the Director of National Intelligence. Elizondo is a proud Army veteran and later served his country throughout the world, including South Korea, Latin America, the Caribbean, Afghanistan, and other countries in the Middle East. Elizondo is a graduate of the University of Miami, where he studied microbiology and immunology.

This publication has garnered a lot of praise and thumbs up. Lou, who has now quit the system, has also garnered criticism from those questioning the evidence. Some have even questioned Elizondo's former credentials. In the appendix is a copy of letter from the late Harry Reid, former senator from Nevada from 1987 to 2017, verifying Lou's leadership role in program AATIP. Many of Lou's critics seem to conjecture that despite what the author claims to have happened, as of yet, no actual UFO/AIP evidence has ever been revealed. Certainly not to the eyes of the critic. In other words, "[I'm going to] move along... nothing to see here...". For example. On September 3, 2024, from the publication, SCI NEWS (Science News) is the following quote:


controversial interpretations and offer up different alternative perspectives on such matters. Lou expressed legitimate concerns about protecting our planet from what appears to him to be evidence of ongoing outside meddling with our planetary affairs. For example, when we started experimenting with nuclear bomb technology, UAP sightings dramatically increased at facilities where nuclear bombs were handled and stored. Subsequent sightings remain an on-going matter.

It should be obvious to most as to why there would be an increase in UAP sightings, particularly at such facilities. If you had discovered one of your nearby backward neighbors, perhaps someone who lives just down the block from your own home had started stockpiling AR –15s in their basement, wouldn't you suddenly start taking a closer interest on what the frak they might be planning to do with them?
